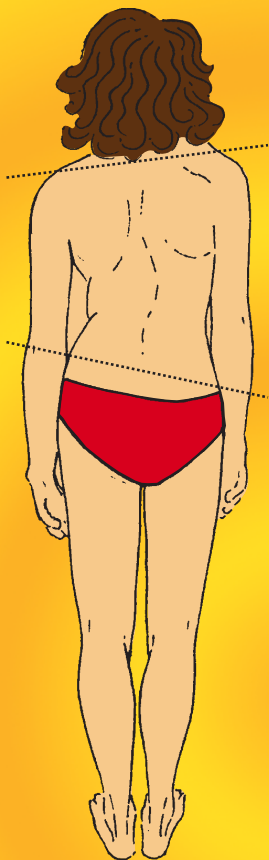


Do you know if your child has Scoliosis?

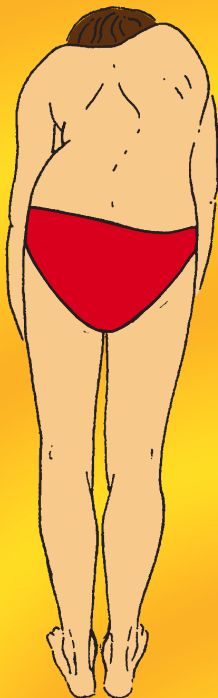
From the age of 8 parents should regularly look for any suggestions of asymmetry in their child.



These signs may include:

- Uneven shoulders and hips
- One shoulder blade sticking out more than the other
- A "dent" in one side of the waist
- Leaning to one side

A more reliable test is to have the child bend over, as in this illustration.



If a bulge appears on one side of the back, there is a likelihood that scoliosis is present.
